
Galston District Garden Club

Council's rural area. We would like the plants to go to landowners who are clearing privet or lantana or other weeds and who wish to revegetate using native plants. Also those who want to revegetate a roadside nature strip.

If that sounds like you, contact Barry Lees on 9653 3691. I will give you a voucher that you can take to the Community Nursery at Pennant Hills to obtain your plants. The minimum number of plants will be 1 tray of 40 tubes. You will need to select from the plants that the nursery has in stock. The nursery manager Ross Rapmund can help you chose plants appropriate to your location and soil type.

You cannot buy local native plants at retail nurseries, so this is a special opportunity. I look forward to your phone call.
